





There are many benefits to recycling your old jewellery. Reusing gold and stones is good from both and ethical and environmental stance, it also has aesthetic and sentimental positives. It is also possible for you to become very involved with how you would like your new piece to look. Heidi is able to generate lifelike images using her state of the art in-house CAD/CAM (Computer Aided Design and Manufacturing) technology. This allows you to view possible designs before settling on the appearance of your desired piece of jewellery.



# How Heidi can use your old gold

Heidi Kjeldsen is able to use the refined Gold from customers' original rings and incorporate gold into new bespoke pieces. Heidi can also use any gemstones which are of sentimental value to you and incorporate them into your new design.

It is also possible to combine jewels and gold from multiple pieces into a single piece, such as a "Bubble Ring", or a pair of sumptuous earrings where Diamonds or gemstones of all sizes and shapes may be included to give a fashionable, contemporary look. The possibilities are numerous, with Heidi and her team ready and happy to advise.

# Make your jewellery even more special

You can recycle your broken Gold chains, odd earrings and any other pieces of jewellery which are past their prime and make something highly desirable. Gold starts out naturally as yellow Gold and it is the presence of white metal alloys which changes the colour to white so don't be afraid to mix metals. Your recycled Gold goes through various processes including melting and refining resulting in Fine Gold, which is 99% pure and looks like the Gold grains you can see in the photograph. It is then alloyed to 9ct or 18ct Gold ready to be used in your new design.

If you do not have enough Gold from your old jewellery to complete the new desired jewel Heidi will estimate to supply additional Gold to create your final bespoke piece.

Finishing touches to make your new jewellery even more special may be added; a poignant engraving to the inside of a ring, or initials on a pendant.

Whether you wish to create a stylish yet timeless Gold bangle, or to explore the possibilities of more complex gemstone set pieces, you will be surprised at what can be achieved.

# keep your jewellery sparkly and safe

Even though your jewellery looks stunning now, sometimes there is a misconception that fine jewellery is invincible and requires no care. Sadly this is not the case, even diamonds, which are hardest wearing on the 'Mohs'\* scale (can suffer chips or cracks from hard blows. With this in mind below you will find some care notes which, if followed. will help ensure your jewellery keeps you smiling well into the future.

#### **General Care**

There are some guidelines to heed with all jewellery to keep it safe.

It is always best to remove jewellery when partaking in a strenuous activity which could knock or damage it for example, gardening, sport or DIY. Take jewellery off when you go to bed and place in a soft lined box where multiple pieces won't rub together and therefore scratch. Both seawater and chlorine can tarnish jewellery and be mindful to avoid contact with other chemicals too. An immediate rinse in clean, water will help if your jewellery does come into contact with chemicals.



### Pearl Jewellery Cleaning and Care

Because Pearls are porous ideally you should not get them wet. When applying makeup, hair products or perfume do so first before putting on your Pearls. When you have finished wearing them use a soft lint free cloth to gently wipe any residue from them, and return them to their own box for safe keeping, as they are relatively soft and can be scratched or damaged by other jewellery. Pearls should be restrung as soon as their silk shows signs of deterioration, we usually recommend an annual restring to ensure they last as long as possible before losing their lustre and "dying". If the silk becomes stretched, grey or worn then your pearls are going to be at risk of damage or even loss. Pearls should be strung with a special double knot in between to prevent them rubbing against one another and so wear away the surround of the fragile area around the drill holes which then hastens their demise.

### **Keeping Diamonds Dazzling**

Diamonds are very hard and so are unlikely to become damaged or scratched, although this can happen if care is not taken. Diamonds adhere to grease, so will actively attract residues. Simply clean them in warm soapy water with a soft brush or with Razzle Dazzle® jewellery cleaner to remove

greasy build up. Ultrasonic or steam jewellery cleaning are also options, but a professional should always carry either of these out as it is possible to cause damage if done without due care and attention. Never store your rings up against one another as Diamonds will scratch other Diamonds, and also all other Gemstones and all Precious Metals too!

# Keep your Gemstones Glittering:

Sapphires, Rubies, Topaz, Citrine, Garnet, Rose Quartz and Amethyst will all clean well in warm soapy water, or as with Diamonds Razzle Dazzle® jewellery cleaner, which may be applied using a soft brush or cloth to remove all residues and leave the Gemstones sparkling and showing their true beauty once again.

Emeralds are fragile, brittle stones and as such a gentle polish with a soft cloth is recommended to avoid damage. Ultrasonic machine use or jewellery dips are not recommended for Emerald jewellery.

Tanzanite is a relatively soft stone, only as hard as Opal, and as such should be treated with great care. A soft cloth and very little cleaning should be carried out, as damage can occur if treated harshly. To preserve the beauty of your rare

Tanzanite jewellery I recommend it is used as dress jewellery as the facets will become worn and dull if worn whilst carrying out everyday tasks such as washing up or gardening. The same advice is given for Turquoise, Opal, Mother of Pearl, Malachite, Amber, Moonstone and Lapis Lazuli as all of these are relatively soft gemstones whose shine may be lost if dipped or polished harshly.

# Give Gold and Silver a shine:

Gold and Silver will all tarnish (oxidise). and as such cleaning is required to keep these items looking fresh and sparkling. There are many Gold and Silver cleaning products on the market including impregnated cloths and dips. Do read the instructions carefully, as some can actually remove plating and leave you will base metal underneath, whilst some will subsequently hasten the tarnishing after you have dipped them. We recommend a soft cloth and Razzle Dazzle® jewellery cleaner, which is usually all that is required to maintain the lustre of these metals. Heavier deposits on Silver may well require professional cleaning and polishing to remove the tarnish. Sometimes this oxidation can be quite damaging, leaving pits in the surface of the metal, requiring proper polishing to regain the lustre. White gold tends to be Rhodium Plated to give it a very bright, white appearance and it is a relatively inexpensive process to have your jewellery re-plated and polished as new when this plating has worn off due to wear and tear or even polishing. The higher the carat of yellow gold the more easily it will scratch so it is important to avoid situations where there is potential for heavy wear and

#### **Polish Platinum:**

Platinum is a relatively inert metal which means it hardly oxidises so a soft cloth and a polish with Razzle Dazzle® jewellery cleaner is usually all that we would recommend. However, Platinum can become dull and scratched over a period of time and then we recommend a professional clean and polish which will restore your Platinum to its former glory.



### Gold or Silver Plated Jewellery

To clean gold-plated jewellery, clean it gently with a liquid soap and warm water to remove any dirt or oils, then rinse in clean water and dry thoroughly with a soft clean cloth.



### Prevent a lost stone and a broken heart:

Ring Claws are the settings which often hold the precious gemstones and Diamonds in place on your jewellery. It is well worth having these professionally checked at least annually so as to ensure that they have not been knocked or become worn, as the saying goes "A stitch in time...". The first sign of claws catching or pulling on your clothes is the alert that all is not well, and that your ring requires quite urgent attention. It is similar to having a car; you need to service and maintain your jewellery well in order to ensure that it lasts and continues to give you joy for the future years.

Any jewellery you may purchase from Heidi Kjeldsen Ltd comes complete with a complementary lifetime checking and jewellery cleaning service, but if you have jewellery that you would like checking or valuing please do arrange an appointment for us to evaluate your collection.

### TAKE YOUR JEWELLERY FOR AN MOT

When you purchase a piece of jewellery from Heidi Kjeldsen you will also receive a small but extremely important, orange booklet. You will want to keep this safe and bring it with you every time you have your jewellery checked, cleaned or valued at Heidi Kjeldsen Fine Jewellers. It will serve as an important reminder for you to have your jewellery checked in the future as we will write a suggested date for you to do so when you bring the jewellery in to our Oakham showroom. It will also help you immensely should you ever have the misfortune to require an insurance claim to replace your jewellery. Think of it like the book you have stamped whenever your vehicle is serviced.





The delicate nature of Murano glass and the way it captures natural light made it the perfect medium to work with for one of the pieces which features in the Aurora Collection. Its natural qualities make it appear to sparkle from deep within. Drops of striking colour can show delicate beads, floral in appearance or broader swirls can give a magical air to the piece, as with this mystifying vortex pendant created especially for Aurora, Its green and darker swirls emanate from an almost unfathomable point within the pendant and its appearance is not dissimilar the Aurora Borealis.

To create these exquisite glass pendants and beads Heidi requires a keen eye and a steady hand. There are different creative techniques which can be used, but the method which allows Heidi to incorporate the most artistic flair into her beads involves a technique called Lampworking.

Firstly, Heidi melts a rod of Murano glass onto a metal mandrel (a stainless steel straight wire) and forms the desired shape by a constant rotation of the mandrel by hand. Heidi then melts various coloured rods of Murano glass and adds the dots, swirls and other patterns into the hot glass bead whilst it is still soft.

The real beauty of this technique is the endless choice of colours and designs which can be explored, each jewellery piece having its own distinctive style, from flatteringly feminine to head-turning glamour.
